The New Year – Birthday of the World – ראֹש הַשֶּנַה (Rosh Hashanah)

It is said that the earth was created on the 1st day of the seventh month. The Bible never plainly states what day the earth was created nor does it command or forbid us from celebrating it.

Historically the turn of the year was numbered by different standards. The patriarchs measured years based upon genealogy. After the Exodus, Moses recorded events from the year our fathers left Egypt based on the 1st of Nissan. During the reign of the kings, years were measured based upon the rule of the monarchy. After Judah's first exile to Babylon, years were measured based upon what we know today as Rosh Hashanah.

The first allusion to the day of creation is in Gen 1:1 with בְּרֵאשִׁית (b'roshiyth). When the letters are rearranged they produce א אבתשרי is the Hebrew number for '1'. ב is a house and means 'in', 'on' or 'with'. תשרי (Tishri) is the seventh month on the Hebrew calendar (f4). Strung together it states '1st in Tishri'.

Our Messiah is scheduled to return on a future Yom T'ruah. When we follow the pattern first described by Moses (Ps 90:3, f5) and later emphasized by Peter (2 Pet 3:8), this would be the 1st day of the seventh day which would start the millennial reign.

Let us celebrate Rosh Hashanah, the birthday of the world, with hope and love towards one another.

11. 1 Thess 4:17, from the south being to the right (next in order) of the east (Strongs: 8486)

a. 17 Then we which are alive *and* remain will be caught up together with them in the clouds, to meet the Lord in *the* air: and so will we ever be with the Lord.

- 12. The Hebrew word for leek 'karti' sounds like the Hebrew word for cut down 'karet' (r4)
- 13. The Hebrew word for date 'tamar' sounds like the Hebrew word for cease 'tam' (r4)
- 14. Traditionally a ram's head or a fish head was used for this blessing. If a ram's head is used, an additionally blessing is said in reference to Abraham's test of Isaac. (r4, r5)
- 15. The Hebrew word for gourd 'kara' sounds like the Hebrew word for tear or rend 'kara' (r4) and announce 'kara' (r5)
- 16. Deut 30:1-3
 - a. 1 And it will come to pass, when all these things are come upon you, the blessing and the curse, which I have set before you, and you will call them to mind among all the nations, where the LORD your God has driven you, 2 And will return unto the LORD your God, and will obey his voice according to all that I command you this day, you and your children, with all your heart, and with all your soul;
 - 3 *That* then the LORD your God will turn your captivity, and have compassion upon you, and will return and gather you from all the nations, where the LORD your God has scattered you.

- 17. The pomegranate represents the commandments of God and traditionally has 613 seeds.
- 18. ELIJAH THE PROPHET

English Translation

Elijah the prophet

Elijah the Tishbite, (stranger in a strange land / foreigner)

Elijah the Giladite (hill of testimony / mound of witness)

In haste and in our days may he come to us

with Messiah son of David. (x2) (r6)

- 19. The King James included 'who is to come' which is added. I chose to leave it out in this case as it destroys an important aspect of the verse, namely, that Yahshua isn't coming when this event takes place, he is here.
- 20. The ten Days of Awe are a time of reflection leading up Yom Kippur. Begin each day by reading the Word (Ten commandments) that corresponds to that day from Exodus 20. Think about that Word and measure your life to see where you have fallen short. Repent and take heart to improve yourself in that area over the coming year. End each day by reading the Word that corresponds to that day from Deut 5.
